VOIX ESSENTIELLES

ENGAGING WOMEN AND GIRLS IN DECISION MAKING SPACES

Launched in 2021, Voix EssentiELLES aims to strengthen women and girls, in all of their diversity, by meaningfully engaging them in decision-making processes and spaces that influence health policies and programs. It is only when women and girls are empowered and supported to actively participate in decision-making processes, that effective policies that take into account gender differences and cultural sensitivities are developed. Open to organizations in Burkina Faso, Cote d'Ivoire and Senegal, Voix EssentiELLES will channel small funds through a dedicated fund to invest in the capacities of community-based grassroots organizations, groups and networks as well as their leaders.



AFRICAN VOICES OF SCIENCE

LEVERAGING CREDIBLE VOICES TO FIGHT MISINFORMATION

As part of the COVID-19 response, it was crucial to tackle the spread of misinformation across Africa through accurate and factual reporting. The initiative, 'African Voices of Science', launched in 2021, works with leading scientists to champion research and development in Africa to generate an open public discourse on key health challenges and solutions. Influential scientists such as Professors Awa Marie Coll-Seck and Samba Sow have lent their voices to the initiative, ensuring that African communities have credible experts they can rely on and can access factual health information.

INVESTING IN AFRICA'S FUTURE



STAY SAFE AFRICA

MANAGING CRISIS COMMUNICATION DURING A GLOBAL PANDEMIC

COVID-19 required an immediate response, ensuring that health services were protected and progress in tackling issues such as malaria, immunization, Neglected Tropical Diseases and inadequate access to sanitation was not compromised. Launched rapidly at the beginning of the pandemic, Stay Safe Africa, seeks to empower communities and individuals to take simple and proven preventative measures to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. The campaign is building trust in vaccines among the general public to promote uptake, while simultaneously advocating for equitable access to these vaccines to support the World Health Organization, and national governments' response plans.





ZERO MALARIA

CREATING A MOVEMENT AGAINST MALARIA

Zero Malaria Starts with Me is a pan-African campaign that mobilizes and empowers communities to take ownership over the fight to end malaria. The campaign drives action from political, private sector and community leaders to accelerate malaria prevention and treatment and save lives. Launched in 2014 in Senegal by Speak Up Africa, this movement has been expanded by the African Union and RBM Partnership to End Malaria to over 20 countries.

In 2020, this movement, with the support of the Ecobank Group, expanded to include the private sector. The Zero Malaria Business Leadership Initiative is set out to drive private-sector engagement on the fight against malaria in Africa, and has launched in Burkina Faso, Benin and Senegal. There are further plans to expand this initiative to Uganda and Ghana in 2021.



CAPOOP

UNITING ORGANIZATIONS FOR ACCESS TO SANITATION

The Communications, Advocacy, Policy Opportunities and Outreach for Poop (CAPOOP) is an alliance of organizations committed to achieving access to adequate and equitable sanitation and hygiene for all, and end open defecation, paying special attention to the needs of women and girls and those in vulnerable situations by 2030. Prior to this collaborative, we launched in 2016, our Golden Sludge campaign, working in close collaboration with national institutions that are directly responsible for the development and implementation of sanitation programs. The Golden Sludge campaign aims to increase awareness, prioritization levels and commitment to improve access to adequate and equitable sanitation for all in Africa.



NO TO NTDS

PUTTING AN END TO NEGLECTED TROPICAL DISEASES

The No to NTDs Movement, launched in 2019, is a grassroot movement aimed at increasing awareness, prioritization and national commitment to accelerate the control and elimination of NTDs in Africa. This movement showcases the critical role each and every one of us has to play to eliminate neglected tropical diseases. The movement also led to the creation of the first ever African Civil Society Organization coalition on NTDs, which has now grown to include 12 members from Senegal, Guinea, Niger and Benin.

Harnessing our long-standing relationships with cultural influencers, celebrities and decision makers, we are proud of our collaboration to inspire action around pressing public health and development issues across the African continent.
